Create a poem or a rap about urban art or amazing urban spaces or buildings. You could even perform or present your final work to the rest of the class!

**Look at images of incredible urban landmarks - for example the Gherkin or Shard in London. Can you design or make your own incredible building? Include labelling.

**Read non-fiction books/use the Internet to find out about local landmarks like the Bottle of Notes, Transporter Bridge or Angel of the North. Create an information board or booklet.

**Use a range of materials from home to create your own, amazing model of a famous, local landmark for example the Angel of the North or Transporter Bridge.



Using Google Street View, see if you can visit 3 different famous city centres. Maybe New York, Rio de Janeiro or Paris. Write or draw a short description of them or take screen shots and label.

Write a short story about visiting a famous landmark in another country. It could be the in London, Tokyo, Los Angeles or anywhere in the world. Use Google street

Imagine a friend from another city or country came to visit. Plan a tour of the Middlesbrough or the North East. Where would you take them? Why? Can you include images?

**Make a piece of graffiti (on paper, card or any other material). It could be your name, or like many graffiti artists a 'tag' eg Banksy. Use bright colours and bold
